- Socio-economic issues


#### **Primary care:**

### What is it like now?




Impact on diagnosis

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## **Screening beliefs**



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Nearly 9 in 10 believe that screening can save lives

6 in 10 patients asked would have participated in a screening programme before their diagnosis.

9 in 10 believe that lung cancer screening should be available in their country
