CHAIRMAN AT FIPRA INTERNATIONAL

Robert is the Chairman of Fipra International Ltd, and a Visiting Research Fellow at the University of Oxford's Centre for Technology and Global Affairs.

Previously (2004-16) Robert was a senior leader at the European Commission: as Senior Adviser for Innovation, as Director General for Communications Networks, Content and Technology (CONNECT) and as Director General for Health and Consumer Policy (SANCO).

Robert was also a negotiator for 20 years in international trade and investment, first for the UK, and then for the EU: Robert served notably in the Cabinet of European Commission Vice-President Leon Brittan. Robert studied at Magdalen College (1976-9) and at the French Civil Service College (ENA). He is an Honorary Doctor of the University of Edinburgh and an Honorary Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of London. Stella KYRIAKIDES

COMMISSIONER FOR HEALTH AND FOOD SAFETY

As European Commissioner for Health and Food Safety, Stella Kyriakides has been leading the Commission's work on the public health response to COVID-19.

Commissioner Kyriakides is responsible for a number of initiatives in the area of health aiming to establish a strong European Health Union. These include Europe's Beating Cancer Plan, the implementation of the EU Pharmaceutical Strategy, the proposal for a European Health Data Space and the operationalisation of the EU4Health Programme. She is a strong advocate for mental health.

Commissioner Kyriakides is also responsible for the 'Farm to Fork' strategy for sustainable food, covering every step in the transformation of the food chain from production to consumption. Her responsibilities include animal welfare, food safety and animal health as well as leading the work to protect plant health and reducing dependency on pesticides.

Since February 2022, Commissioner Kyriakides has been at the forefront of EU efforts to support Ukraine and its people in the area of health, including by supporting the protection of the physical and mental health of Ukrainian refugees arriving in Member States.

In 2006-2019, she was elected to the Cyprus Parliament for the Democratic Rally party, of which she was the Vice-President for ten years.

In 2011, she was appointed Head of the Cyprus Delegation to the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe (PACE). In 2017, she was elected President of the PACE, the fourth woman to hold this position in the history of the Assembly. She has been an active advocate on patients rights, and on the rights of cancer patients, founding the first Cypriot breast cancer organisation Europa Donna Cyprus, for which she served as President for over 15 years. She was elected President to the European Breast Cancer Coalition Europa Donna, and served on numerous European patient advocacy and scientific boards.

She is the recipient of numerous awards from her community service in Cyprus and globally.





Dirk VAN DEN STEEN

DEPUTY HEAD OF UNIT PERFORMANCE OF HEALTH SYSTEMS DG SANTE, EUROPEAN COMMISSION

Dirk Van den Steen is an economist working at the European Commission's Directorate General For Health and Food Safety (DG SANTE) as Deputy Head of the unit covering the performance of national health systems.

Prior to joining the Commission in 2009, Dirk worked at the actuarial department of the Belgian public payer organisation RIZIV/INAMI dealing with the database architecture of hospital billing/clinical information, the Belgian Healthcare Knowledge Centre (KCE) as a health economist involved with health technology assessment (HTA) and with IMS Health (now called IQVIA) as a consultant in pharmaco-economic modelling for the pharmaceutical industry.

At the European Commission in the past Dirk has been involved in the development of the Cross-border Healthcare Directive, notably working on the mutual recognition of cross-border prescriptions as well as the assessment of national health systems. In the area of medical products at the European Commission Dirk also worked at the European Commission DG for Competition on antitrust enforcement in the domain of pharmaceuticals, devices and health services as well as on the Pharmaceutical Strategy for Europe, notably with regard to access to affordable medicines.

Most recently, Dirk was in particular involved in the assessment of proposed health system investments by Member States under the Recovery and Resilience Facility.



Prof. Gunhild WALDEMAR

PRESIDENT, BIOMED ALLIANCE

Gunhild Waldemar, MD, DMSc, FEAN, is professor of clinical neurology at the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, and chair of the Danish Dementia Research Centre, Dept. of Neurology, Rigshospitalet in Copenhagen. From 2022-2023 she serves as the President of Biomedical Alliance in Europe.

In 1995 she established the first multidisciplinary memory clinic in Denmark, and in 2007 the Danish Dementia Research Centre with nationwide educational and networking activities as well as research, funded by the Danish Ministry of Health and the Health Foundation. Her research interests are clinical and epidemiological research and intervention studies in Alzheimer's disease and other dementias.

Prof. Waldemar serves as a board member of the Medical and Scientific Advisory Panel of Alzheimer's Disease International, and the Expert Advisory Panel of Alzheimer Europe. She also serves as the coordinating professor of the Neuroscience Center at Rigshospitalet, and consultant advisor of the Danish Legal Medicine Council at the Danish Ministry of Justice.

She was one of the leading forces in the establishment of the new European Academy of Neurology in 2014. Since 2016 she has served on the board of the Biomedical Alliance in Europe and since 2011 on the board of directors of the Lundbeck Foundation, where she chairs the Grants and Prize Committee.





Andrej PLESNIČAR

HEALTH INSURANCE INSTITUTE OF SLOVENIA

Andrej Plesničar, MD, MSc, Specialist in Social Medicine, is a consultant at Health Insurance Institute of Slovenia (HIIS). After graduating at the University of Ljubljana - Faculty of Medicine he worked at Primary Health Center in Medvode, Slovenia, Institute of Oncology in Ljubljana, Slovenia, Centro di Riferimento Oncologico in Aviano, Italy, and as a Senior lecturer at the University of Ljubljana - Faculty of Health Sciences.

He is currently working on the development of new accounting and payment models at HIIS and actively participating in several analytical and development projects at the Ministry of Health in Slovenia and elsewhere.
